Most Recent ASU Definition (No change)


ASU Qualification Requirements: An area must meet three requirements to be an ASU

- Unemployment rate—the 12-month average not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the reference period (July 2018 benchmarked through June 2019 preliminary) must be at least 6.5 percent. Note that ASU *parts* do not need to meet this requirement individually—only the *whole* ASU must meet it.
- *Population*—its population must be **at least 10,000** persons based on Census Bureau figures, as described below.
- *Geography*—it must be a contiguous geographic area composed of any combination of counties, cities, census tracts, or other areas within a State. If two areas are separated by a body of water (for example, river, lake, ocean) they can be contiguous if the two areas are directly across the body of water from one another. Contiguity is also achieved when two areas touch at only one point, as four square counties might touch.


Estimating Census Tract Unemployment

- We use the most recent American Community Survey 5-year estimates (2015-2019 for current estimates) of employment, unemployment and population.
- The ACS Census Tract-level data (tract shares of county) are used to distribute county-level LAUS employment and unemployment estimates for the reference period (most recent July to June period) across the component Census Tracts.




Minnesota ASU Areas PY2017

Numbers Correspond with ASU Code







Similar Process for WSA Allocations

- We update to most recent calendar year (now 2020) LAUS estimates (6-month forward shift)
- Again we use ACS 5-year estimates (2015-2019) to distribute most recent calendar year's LAUS county, Duluth and Minneapolis employment and unemployment estimates to Census Tracks
- Limit ASU designations to WSA geographies, subject to same (6.5% unemployment, 10,000 population, contiguous geographies) constraints.



Pop = 10,000 and Urate = 6.5%

467 of 1,338 (34.9%) of census tracts have unemployment rates >= 6.5%

These tracts are spread across more WSAs than is typical with 11 WSAs having more than 25 tracts each.

Only 6 WSAs have fewer than 20 tracts with rates >=6.5%
