# Dislocated Worker and Federal Adult Programs

#### PY20 Data Freeze:

- July 9, 2021. This means, all data you'd like included in the PY20 annual reports (state and WIOA) will need to be in the system by COB 7/9/2021.
  - The main area to concentrate on is Measurable Skill Gains; every participant that attended training at any time during the program year (07/01/2020 06/30/2021) must have at least one MSG on their record during that same time or it will be a negative in the MSG measure.
  - o Amy C. will be sending each partner a report with instructions.

## New Workforce One Questions (relating to new DWGs):

• New Questions on WF1 – "Do you, family, friends have a history of opioid abuse?" this question is voluntary, but helpful for assessing if we need to scale the Opioid grant statewide.

# Legislative Direct Appropriation Grants/ Competitive Grants SFY20/21

State Legislators continue to meet, and the ACP team is watching these sessions closely as the final budget will determine SFY22-23 program budgets. We expect that RFPs will be released summer 2021.

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The ACP Team released a Tech Training Pilot Project RFP on March 11<sup>th</sup>, with a due date of Friday April 30<sup>th</sup>. This is a new program within ACP serving adults 18-30 and targeting underrepresentation of BIPOC communities in the Technology field.

## SNAP E&T 50/50

DEED has contracted with a total of eight SNAP E&T 50% Reimbursement Grantees for SFY21. This program offers 50% reimbursement (up to \$200,000 this year) on expenses already incurred through ACP's Pathways to Prosperity and Mn Family Resiliency Partnership programs.

#### ACP Operations Guide

ACP's <u>Operations Guide</u> is now available from <u>the ACP home page</u>. The Guide documents current practices for ACP. The ACP Team meets monthly to discuss suggested additions, updates, modifications, and other changes to the guide and update as necessary. The Guide is intended to be a living document and will be updated as procedures evolve. It does NOT include <u>measures implemented in response to COVID-19</u>, which are listed separately.

## **Reversion and Sunset Clauses**

Blog from DOL re: Reversion and Sunset Clauses of the 2015 TAA Program

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Minnesota TAA will follow Department of Labor's guidance for continued guidance and planning.

**Reversion 2021:** Without Congressional action, on July 1, 2021, the TAA Program will revert to a modified version of the Trade Reform Act of 2002. Any workers covered under a Petition for Trade Adjustment Assistance filed on or after July 1, 2021, would be covered by this modified version.

**Sunset Provisions:** Again, this is <u>only if</u> no Congressional action is taken. The TAA Program will sunset (expire) on June 30, 2022. No additional Petitions will be accepted after that time. No additional funding will be awarded after June 30, 2022. Unexpended funds from previous, but active, fiscal years will still be available for expenditure subject to any restrictions explained in the Operating Instructions.

- Pending Department of Labor (DOL) determination: five (5) petitions
- Recently denied: DeCare Dental, St Paul
