What is Project SEARCH?

 Project SEARCH is an evidence-based one-year internship program for students with intellectual/developmental cognitive disabilities, ages 18-21, in their last year of high school eligibility.








Story

Goal of the Program



The goal of Project SEARCH is for interns to obtain competitive, integrated employment within four to eleven months after completion of their internship experience.

Minnesota Outcomes

Project SEARCH started in Minnesota in 2009.

As of 2020, 256 interns have participated in Project SEARCH.

75% have obtained competitive integrated employment.

Structure

- The nine-month program takes place in a business setting, where each intern is fully immersed with individualized work expectations
- Total immersion facilitates the acquisition of employability and marketable work skills
- Students rotate work experiences every ten weeks (3 rotations)







Internships/Worksite Rotations:

- Through a series of THREE internship rotations, the students acquire competitive, marketable and transferable skills to enable them to apply for a related position.
- Students also build communication, teamwork and problem-solving skills which is important to their overall development as a young worker.





Employment Skills Curriculum

Throughout the school year, the students work on employability skills for approximately one hour of their day.

Classroom activities are designed around the areas of:

- ✓ Team Building
- Self Advocacy
- **✓** Technology
- ✓ Maintaining Employment

- ✓ Workplace Safety
- Health and Wellness
- ✓ Financial Literacy
- Preparing for Employment
