WIOA State Plan

- Current WIOA State Plan is for PY2020-23
- New federal guidance came out just before Christmas on modifications
- Kay Kammen, GWDB staff, leading coordination on our end to compile modifications/revised language; we're both working with ETP, CF, & others on some pieces
- Process Overview (Rough Timeline):
 - End of January/early February: GWDB compiles new language from across agencies; develops own language as it relates to the “strategic elements”
 - Mid-February: GWDB Operations Committee reviews proposed modifications, makes recs
 - State Plan modifications then posted for public comment (30 days)
 - March 15: deadline to submit to US DOL
 - Based on federal timelines, modifications are unlikely to include latest performance negotiations (between DEED-DOL) – meaning these will be submitted at a later date
 - Once submitted: GWDB staff can shift gears to focus more on Local/Regional Planning

WIOA Local/Regional Plans

- Letter sent out to WDBs from Commissioner Grove:
 - GWDB will now oversee Local/Regional Planning work for DEED
 - Goal is to create more alignment between State and Local/Regional Plans – GWDB best positioned to do
- MAWB (via Jeanna) sent out an email on 1/11/22 with some concerns, along with chairs of multiple local boards. Some points addressing these concerns:
 - **We will proceed moving forward by considering *the Local/Regional Plans submitted to DEED by LWDBs in 2021 as APPROVED***
 - **GWDB staff will work with MAWB and the DEED CO to determine if 7/31/22 is the best date, or if additional time will benefit our system**
 - **GWDB staff will prioritize guidance for Local/Regional Plan modifications after the WIOA State Plan has been submitted to US DOL**
- GWDB staff will work to make sure someone is in place to coordinate Local/Regional Plans specifically, and ideally, to also provide technical assistance around strategic planning, community engagement, or other supports year-round
- GWDB Director will send out a letter to LWDBs summarizing these points

Hiring International Students (H-1B Visa Holders)

Virtual Event for Employers, LWDBs, Other WFD Partners

- GWDB New Americans Task Force launched earlier this month
 - Tammy Biery representing MAWB as a member
 - Main deliverables: Written Report; Framework for Engaging, Supporting, & Training Nas
 - Work includes employer engagement & informational sessions
- Will be holding 1-2 virtual informational events for employers, workforce boards, and others with questions about the barriers/red tape to hiring international students
- Presenter will be an experienced immigration attorney with relevant statewide knowledge
- Have been working with Elena, but would like to make this statewide
- Local boards can invite employers once we set a date (likely in March)
 - Any dates to avoid or consider?
 - Other thoughts, reactions, or ideas?

Coursera (continued)

- Coursera: not a training provider, doesn't own most of the curriculum itself
 - Over 8,000 courses in MN's catalog, from over 200 universities or businesses
 - Makes putting on the ETPL difficult, but doesn't render it useless to the WFD system
- 2020-21: ANY Minnesotan could get access (unlimited licenses at DEED)
- 2021-April 20, 2022: fewer full-access licenses, many *accessing through CBOs*
 - DW Programs (especially State)
 - Pathways Programming
 - WIOA Parameters: federal regs make little easier to work w/ Youth than others
- DEED Veterans Program (73 joined, 40 active); some utilization by VRS

Digital Reskilling Efforts

- MN surpassed the 13,000 course completion mark on Coursera
 - IT/tech by far the most sought-after
 - Also project management, data analytics, and more
- Existing work with CBOs to utilize curriculum
- CPL work with MN State Colleges & Universities
 - Pre-Mapped walkthroughs for how Minnesotans can get CPL for specific Coursera certs
 - BIG announcement in the next 2-3 weeks (hoping 1 school in each RWDA)
- Current initiative (free access to Coursera) ends after 4/30/22
- After 4/30/22: Grow with Google offer
 - Utility for Local Boards? (Google willing to provide directly to LWDBs or thru DEED)
 - NASWA – offer for state agencies to access through NASWA
 - DEED could potentially partner directly with Google

Grow with Google

- Potential for MN/DEED to get free access to [Grow with Google professional certificates](#) content
- If taken up on their offer, Minnesota would have access to these Professional Certificates from Google:
 - **IT Support** (*carries an ACE College Credit Recommendation – 12 college credits*)
 - **Project Management** (*carries an ACE College Credit Recommendation*)
 - **Data Analytics** (*carries an ACE College Credit Recommendation*)
 - **UX Design** (*carries an ACE College Credit Recommendation*)
 - **IT Automation with Python**
- IT Support: most popular program Minnesotans are accessing
 - Prepares someone for an entry-level IT Support/Help Desk role
 - Largely mirrors the CompTIA A+ Exam coursework
 - Google actively hires from this learner pool, as do other larger employers (<https://googlecerts.courserajobplatform.org/employers>)
 - One of the professional certs we'll be announcing CPL opportunities with MN State
 - Interest from some industry partners to somehow partner to develop/expand talent

Digital Reskilling Efforts

- **Main Question: Thoughts on Google's offer? Suggestions on delivery?**
- Many learners want “on-demand” training, which helps “meet them where they're at”, as evidenced by the usage data. Can our WFD system meet this?
- 6 different CBOs “connected the dots” and used for some program participants – easier if non-WIOA but still possible with WIOA – but we didn't have any local boards using it regularly
- Other than ETPL and concerns/federal regs not addressing something like Coursera, are there barriers to think about to make tools like Coursera useful for our system at the local level?
