DEED Updates

- Adult Team: General Updates, Adult Career Pathways, WIOA Adult & Dislocated Worker, Trade Adjustment Assistance. See new organizational chart. <u>See written updates</u>. See also PY21 Q1 performance documents on the <u>committee page</u>.
- Job Service
 - Good Jobs Now phone calls to UI applicants continue, but the pool of UI applicants has started to diminish. Job Service will now increase efforts on follow-up calls and referrals.
- CareerForceMN.com
 - The Training Program Finder was put on the platform last Friday. Website visitors can search for no-cost training programs. Each listing will include the date, time, location, information on how to participate, outcomes, and eligibility requirements. DHS Updates

• SNAP E&T: Shared two policy reminders.

1) "A DWP participant can be co-enrolled in SNAP E&T (or vice versa), but you cannot seek reimbursement from SNAP E&T for anything that was paid for with DWP funds. For example, if you were working with a co-enrolled individual and you bought them work boots, and you paid for those work boots with DWP funding (or, in more practical terms, you paid for those work boots with funds that your accounting system would charge to DWP ultimately) you could not seek SNAP E&T reimbursement on those boots. In short, DWP funds cannot be reimbursed by SNAP E&T."

There is a section in the old and new versions of the handbook on co-enrollment, and not much is different between the two versions. The co-enrollment section in the old version is on page 14. If you are looking for additional information on what you can seek reimbursement for, for a co-enrolled individual, see page 19 or in the <u>guidance on costs</u> <u>available online</u>. However, neither of these resources specifically addresses DWP. The DHS team will work to update the handbook to address this.

2) Educational programs must be two years or less and lead straight to employment, so fouryear college students would not qualify nor would an associate degree (AA).
