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1. What is the mission of this committee?

In partnership with DEED, MAWB, and the GWDB, the Policy and Issues Committee provides solution-oriented information and guidance to policy makers through research and systematic and inclusive discussion in all matters affecting workforce development.

-Identify policies that are inequitable or contribute towards inequities and recommend changes

-Bring in partners from DEED and other agencies as necessary to contribute to committee discussions, supportive of an integrated state-wide system
