

Adult Education (WIOA Title II) Update

Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (IELCE) Grant

- \$1,107,282 will be going out in grants starting July 1, 2022
- Grantees should be announced by the end of May
- All grant applications must be reviewed by Local Workforce Development Boards. Thank you to the board directors for facilitating this review.

Federal Adult Education Grants

- · Authorizes grantees to receive annual funding
- Grantees should be announced by the end of June
- All grant applications must be reviewed by Local Workforce Development Boards.

Ability-to-Benefit (AtB): State Process submitted by Minnesota State

- Minnesota State has submitted a statewide plan for approval to offer ability-to-benefit to students
- Ability to benefit is a term used in postsecondary education to refer to students who have sufficient
 competency to benefit from postsecondary education but do not have a high school diploma or a High
 School Equivalency (HSE) certificate. This allows someone who needs financial aid to access financial aid
 without a diploma or HSE. There are three ways someone can qualify for AtB. One way is to create a
 state plan and submit if for approval.
- The goal is to have learners complete a postsecondary program while also obtaining a high school equivalency diploma.
- We hope to pilot this with some campuses this fall.

Regional Transitions Aid

There are ten ABE transitions regions in Minnesota. Each region must submit an annual transitions plan
to the state ABE office. This plan must describe capacity building activities that support adult learners
transitioning to employment, training, or postsecondary. Regions typically receive \$50,000. If you have

Board</u> or an <u>ABE Consortium Manager</u>. Regional Transitions Plans are due May 12, 2022.
