

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A CAREER IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY

• What is an apprenticeship?

Apprenticeship training is a formal system of employee training that combines on-the-job training with related technical instruction.

• What does a construction career look like?

Working with hands and mind, working outside, working with a team, and lifelong pride in completed projects that support community development.

• What's in it for YOU?

Pay, training, benefits, work with your hands, work outside, retirement, gateway position to management and business ownership, learn a practical skill.

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

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PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- Be at least 18 years old by May 1, 2022
- Have earned a high school diploma / GED / or equivalent
- Be able to pass a drug screen
- Possess a valid driver's license and reliable transportation
- NOT be currently enrolled in a construction union or construction trade training program
- Legally eligible to work in the U.S
- Ability to communicate in English

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PARTICIPANT EXPECTATIONS

- Attend live or watch recorded sessions
- 2-3 hours of assignments a week
- Maintain consistent and open communication
- Attendance and participation expectations
- Be prepared and ready to accept Apprenticeship employment offers
