Online Statewide Training Courses

It is difficult for some ABE programs, especially in rural areas, to make it financially feasible to offer training courses. Because of this concern, and the employer need for trained individuals, Adult Basic Education is piloting four online statewide training courses this program year. These courses are open to individuals who are eligible for ABE.

Online Statewide Training Course Offered by ABE at no cost to adult learners

- Microsoft Office Specialist (MOS) Course
 - Microsoft Office is a requested skill for employment. This course prepares students to receive a certificate in Word, Excel, and/or PowerPoint. Sessions to onboard new learners are scheduled for April 26th, and May 24th.
- Health Care Core

The course was developed by the Minnesota State HealthForce Center of Excellence. Students earn up to four college credits, and satisfy college prerequisites for many healthcare pathways.

Ability to Benefit

Adult Basic Education and Minnesota State are piloting Ability-to-Benefit on some campuses. This enables eligible individuals to enroll in postsecondary programs and access financial aid without a high school diploma. It must be part of a career pathway where the individual will receive a credential and work towards their high school diploma.
