What is Ability to Benefit (AtB)?

- A provision in the Higher Education Act (HEA)
- Allows a student who has not received HSD/E to be eligible for Title IV Federal student aid (Pell Grants) and Minnesota state financial aid
- Requires students be enrolled in an approved career pathway program

How to Qualify for Ability to Benefit?

First, a student must fulfill one of these alternatives:

Pass an independently administered test approved by the U.S. Department of Education. Complete a State process approved by the Secretary of Education ("statedefined process").

Complete at least 6 college credits applicable toward a degree or certificate offered by an accredited postsecondary institution.

Then the student must be enrolled in an eligible career pathway program.

- Students accepted as ATB students must have college-level courses they can enter while completing their HS credential.
- ATB students cannot use financial aid for developmental education.

Key Elements of Ability to Benefit

- College and ABE Partner have connected and had at least one meeting
- AtB Partnership Checklist has been signed and submitted
- College and ABE Partner each have a designated "point person" for AtB
- Career Pathways have been identified
- Career Pathways have been approved
- Faculty in designated Career Pathways are engaged
- Intra-Agency Agreement has been signed and submitted
- Attend Professional Development monthly meetings.
