- Students enroll through their local ABE program or by contacting the program offering the class.
- The classes are all online. ABE programs provide support with accessing and using technology in order to participate in the class.
- An assessment is provided when students enroll to determine if they are at the appropriate level to be successful in the class.

<b>Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)</b> -Prepares students for passing the TEAS exam for acceptance into a nursing program.	

### Ability-to-Benefit:

Several Minnesota State campuses are implementing the ability-to-benefit state plan. This allows adults without a high school diploma to receive financial aid while they are working to get a GED<sup>®</sup> and working towards a career and technical education credential.

#### Have you heard of the "Ability to Benefit" program, but you're not quite sure what it is?

Ability to Benefit is a federal financial aid rule that allows students without a high school diploma (or an equivalent like a GED diploma or home school diploma) to qualify for financial aid, if they prove they have the "ability to benefit" from a college education.
