recruit, train and *retain* a highly skilled and diverse workforce.




2023 Apprenticeship Program Snapshot

Early Childhood Education Apprenticeships

- Partnership with Child Care Aware of Minnesota
- Registered apprenticeship program launched in August 2023
- 18 apprentices enrolled in 7 childcare centers across the state
- Child Care Aware of Minnesota is coordinating a work group to identify how to implement registered apprenticeship in a family childcare provider setting

K-12 Teacher Apprenticeships

- Statewide Partnerships
 - Minnesota Department of Education
 - Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board
 - Education MN
- Developed statewide model standard for teacher registered apprenticeship programs
 - Elementary Education and Special Education Licensure
- Fall 2024 Launch
 - Minneapolis & Owatonna
 - Intermediate District 916, 917, 287, 288
- Fall 2025 Launch
 - Four other districts exploring options for different licensure areas


Apprenticeship Minnesota

Apprenticeship Funding

Labor Education Advancement Program

- Facilitate the recruitment and retention of people of color, Indigenous people and women in registered apprenticeship programs
- Community-Based Organizations, Nonprofits, and Tribal Governments
- \$1 million annually
- Deadline is March 8



Apprenticeship Funding

Federal Funding

• Applying for a formula and competitive grant

• \$7 million in total

• Includes a focus on partnering with work force boards and creating more alignment with the workforce system

West Michigan Works! apprenticeship programs are highly competitive with set application periods and program requirements. Here are some current healthcare apprenticeship program opportunities.

Medical Assistant Registered Apprenticeship (MARAP):

Medical Assistants perform administrative and clinical duties. They schedule appointments, maintaining medical records, take vital signs and prepare patients for examinations. <u>LEARN MORE</u>

Surgical Technologist Registered Apprenticeship:

Surgical technologists, also called operating room technicians, assist with operations. They prepare operating rooms, arrange equipment, and help doctors during surgeries. <u>LEARN MORE</u>
