**Annual Employment Situation of Veterans – 2023** 

In 2023, there were 17.90 million veterans in the civilian noninstitutional population 18 years and over.

Of those veterans, 8.63 million were in the civilian labor force and 8.39 million were employed.

The annual average unemployment rate was 2.8% in 2023 for veteran, unchanged from the prior year.





### **Unemployment Rates by Disability and Veteran Status**




### October 2023 – September 2024 Averaged \*

### **Unemployment Rates By Gender and Veteran Status**




### October 2023 – September 2024 Averaged \*

### **Underemployment Rate**

While veteran unemployment for September 2024 stands at a commendable 2.8%, a <u>study by LinkedIn</u> paints a concerning picture, revealing that a staggering 33% of underemployed veterans. Moreover, they are 15.6% more likely to face underemployment than their civilian counterparts.

### underemployment disproportionately affects veterans.

While underemployment was relatively similar among veterans and nonveterans in the gap has dramatically increased over the last nine years. The greatest gap occurred in 2017, when veterans were 38% more likely to be underemployed.
