

Ethan is a Public Health Specialist with **Steele County Public Health**, after serving with **Public Health Corps**.




"Serving was one of the best decisions I've ever made."








 Train in leadership development, data collection, and evaluation provided in partnership with The University of Minnesota School of Public Health.


