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Dislocated Worker and Federal Adult Programs (DWFAP)

The Dislocated Worker and Federal Adult Programs Office has posted <u>seven policies</u> for a 30-day public comment period. Comment period is open through March 4, 2025.

- 1. Career Services Allowable Activities
- 2. Definition of Economic Self-sufficiency and Income Exclusion
- 3. Incumbent Worker Programs
- 4. Requests for Supplemental Funding to Serve Small Layoffs
- 5. Supportive Services and Follow-Up Services Allowable Activities
- 6. Training Services Allowable Activities
- 7. Title 1 WIOA Integrated Exit Policy under the multiprogram section

The policies incorporate various updates and changes that are required as well as recommendations received from partners. Comments can be submitted by clicking the "Send a comment" function or by sending comments to dwfaprograms.deed@state.mn.us.

Minnesota Job Skills Partnership Board (MJSP):

Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP):

PY2023 Participant and Host Agency Survey

- Survey in progress. The first wave of participant surveys was mailed on December 9, 2024.
- Two additional waves were scheduled at 3–4-week intervals for non-respondents but mailing of the second and third waves has been delayed. Updates will be provided as progress is made.
- Host Agency Surveys were mailed on February 7, 2025.

Grantee Performance Management System (GPMS)

- GPMS e-News January 2025 Issue Vol 3 is now available.
- The Workforce Integrated Performance System (WIPS), an ETA-operated tool used for calculating grantee performance, is now integrated into GPMS.
 - WIPS supports the reporting of the Quarterly Performance Report (QPR) and the Quarterly Narrative Report (QNR) at the grantee level.
 - As WIPS is interconnected with the State Wage Interchange System (SWIS), which enables wage data sharing among participating state agencies, this integration will enhance SCSEP's employment outcome tracking (Quarter 1 and Quarter 2 Employment Rates, and Median Earnings) in GPMS.
 However, updates will still be subject to a two-quarter delay.
 - o Providers must continue tracking and following up with exited participants for 3 quarters post-exit.

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Upcoming Deadlines:

- Quarter 2 data freeze was extended from February 15, 2025 to March 8, 2025.
- All relevant information, including earnings and paid hours, must be entered into GPMS by March 7, 2025.

Next Quarterly Meeting: Scheduled for February 20, 2025.

Converting Layoffs Into Minnesota Businesses (CLIMB)

- A listening session to discuss policy updates for Converting Layoffs Into Minnesota Businesses (CLIMB) will be on 2/28/25, via MS Teams. This is to hear from employment counselors and/or staff involved with CLIMB on:
 - 1. Steps required prior to entering a CLIMB activity on the participant's record in Workforce One (WF1).
 - 2. CLIMB policy and procedures in general, as well as providing training and consultation to participants.

An email was sent out on February 13 with a link to register. This meeting will not be recorded.

The Grants Team has resumed their Grant Status Meetings with grantees to review PY24FY25 grants. The goal
is to provide opportunities for listening, discussion and collaboration, in an effort to be proactive in addressing
any issues, providing additional support, and enhancing the success of your grant. Last year, the team met
with grantees between July and December and focused on PY23. The feedback has been positive and
encouraging for everyone.

Mass Layoff Projects:

- State Rapid Response Team (SRRT) received a WARN letter on 12/3/24, from Cargill, of the permanent layoffs
 of approximately 475 employees. Cargill Planning and Selection Committee chose Hired to serve the impacted
 workers.
- The State Rapid Response Team (SRRT) received a WARN letter on January 6, 2025, from IV Media, LLC dba ShopHQ, of the permanent layoff of approximately 128 employees from its facilities located in Eden Prairie.
 The Planning and Selection Committee chose Minnesota Job Partners to serve the impacted workers.
